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Dear Parents & Carers,

This week, I'm continuing the theme of Internet Safety and keeping children safe from cyber-bullying. We uncovered the most awful things that were happening due to unchecked access in and out of school hours: children as young as 7 being allowed into Yr6/7 chat rooms through siblings; children posting, ' ugliest/ fattest/ slowest' polls naming other children; children starting WhatsApp groups with an insulting name, inviting a single child and then all exiting and using the derogatory term to message the child and infer their ownership; children using multiple sign ins, some with adult photos encouraging other children to engage...the list was very long. It was truly shocking but I'm sharing with you because it was so awful...don't presume...peer pressure to engage is powerful and despite all of the information given at school, the desire to fit in and be perceived as popular outweighs sense, good teaching and good parenting.

Huge thanks to the many Year 5 and 6 parents who contacted me to say that either, they check their child's phone weekly now, or that they don't do it often enough and were shocked when they did and have taken action at home.



Take care, **Sue Sayers** Headteacher I found this great poster for talking to your children. I hope you find it useful. The only way to stop this is if parents deny access to age limited sites - the restrictions are there for a purpose, they are a maturity rating as much as an age rating - and, as aforementioned, regular checks are being made of children's history and use. There also needs to be more of a culture of children reporting things to adults at home if they find something they are offended by or don't want to engage in.

This incident has caused many parents to ask if their child really needs a phone at school. Many Years 5/6 bring them in because they can but are dropped off and collected so there should be no need on those days. Next year, we are going to be holding some 'no phone' events with other local schools and from September, we will be asking for parents to request permission for their child to bring a phone to school. STEM*.**Challenge Success** (* Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) On Thursday 27th June, a team of six intrepid Herne year 5 pupils attended a one-day event entitled 'Engineers of the Future'. Held at Churcher's College, it was supported by the Royal Academy of Engineering's Connecting STEM Teachers programme & the Smallpiece Trust. With children from other primary schools in the area, our pupils had the opportunity to test their creativity & problem-solving skills in a series of practical technology & engineering challenges.

The activities included a code-breaking challenge: our team cracked all three codes. Next was a competition to design & build the most effective, crash-proof, vehicle. Built from material such as corrugated plastic, dowel and card, the car protected two eggs whilst zooming down a ramp of ever-steepening inclines. Additionally, our team built and tested an air-powered rocket. We won the practical competition where they were fired to see how high they could go! Our superb team of engineers came second overall for their work with 49 points scored, just 0.5 points off the winners!! We are very proud of the team's commitment and

how they represented Herne with their brilliant behaviour. Congratulations Team Herne!
